

GENERAL RULES

Failure to adhere to the following rules could result in loss of all entry money and forfeit of any awards and premiums.

- 1. All exhibitors must be 21 or younger as of January 1st, 2024 to be eligible to show.
- 2. Entry fees are \$45.00 per head per day for all species. Showmanship and exhibitor T-shirts are included in the entry fee. Entries must be completed through Showman.app.
- 3. Entry fee for California Elite Futurity is \$30.00 per head. Hogs must be entered in at least Show A to be eligible for futurity.
- 4. There will be NO refunds of entry money. NO EXCEPTIONS. This includes entries for camping. Camping is transferrable to other families.
- Entries are due Monday, March 25th. Late entries will be accepted until Wednesday, March 27th with an additional \$25 late fee per entry. After this date, we can <u>NOT</u> accept any new exhibitors or entries, NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6. Animals must be entered into Show A to be eligible for Show B. Exhibitors have the option to enter Show A only.
- 7. Exhibitors will receive a show T-shirt as part of their show entry. **Exhibitors are REQUIRED to wear this T-shirt for Show A**. For Showmanship and Sunday shows, we ask that exhibitors wear clean and neat show attire.
- 8. Pens will be assigned prior to load in. Please indicate on entry form if you would like to be stalled near another exhibitor. We will do our best to accommodate stalling requests, but there is no guarantee. Pen space is limited, please come prepared with dividers.
- 9. Exhibitors will have the option to purchase a spot to work out of their trailer from our auction hosted by SC Online Sales on April 2. Date to be determined. Please note trailer spots are limited compared to our previous location.
- 10. Camping is available on show grounds. Please complete the camping request and pay on our entry site. Spots are first come, first served based on PAID entries. Camping is nonrefundable, but can be resold if needed.
- 11. Ethical treatment of all animals and ethical conduct from exhibitors/parents is required.
- 12. The Revival Livestock show and all those associated with the show will assume NO responsibility for death or injury of livestock, personal injury, nor damage to property at the showgrounds.
- 13. Any animals exhibiting signs of infectious disease or any unsightly conditions will not be permitted to show at The Revival.

- 14. Exhibitors must exhibit their own animals, unless prior arrangements have been made in writing with show management. Exceptions will be made only if an exhibitor has two animals in the show ring at the same time, then another eligible exhibitor may show that animal.
- 15. Only shavings are allowed for bedding. Bedding will be available for sale at show grounds.
- 16. Fitting and stalling areas need to be cleaned up prior to load out. Official clean up guidelines will be announced prior to the show.
- 17. Power will be provided by the fairgrounds. To stay compliant with State Fire Marshal **NO GENERATORS** will be be allowed on grounds. We kindly ask you leave generators at home, you will be asked not to unload them with your tack.
- 18. The only intact males allowed to show are hogs weighing less than 125 pounds.
- 19. Show staff has the right to change classes or schedule as they see fit.
- 20. Livestock barns will open for load in at 8:00 AM on Thursday, April 11th. All barns must be vacated by 10:00 PM Sunday, April 14th.
- 21. Hog exhibitors must be checked in and weighed in by 11:00 A.M. Friday, April 12th. Sheep and goat exhibitors must be checked in and weighed in by 4:00 P.M Friday, April 12th.
- 22. Livestock photography will be provided by Empire Imagery and photos will be available for purchase through their business page.
- 23. Class premiums will be paid on a percentage basis and a check will be mailed for all class premiums and champion payouts.
- 24. We are California Youth Livestock Association sanctioned. Show books and results will be published on Showman.app (entry portal)
- 25. Out of state exhibitors must have appropriate health papers.

SHOWMANSHIP

- 1. There will be one showmanship class, showing on Friday. Entry fee for showmanship is included with your market/wether dam entry. Showmanship entry to showmanship will still need to be completed in the entry portal.
- 2. Hog exhibitors must confirm showmanship or scratch by 11:00 A.M. Friday. Sheep/Goat exhibitors must confirm showmanship or scratch by 3:00 P.M. Friday.
- 3. Showmanship will be broken by the following age divisions (age as of 01/01/2024):
 - a. Peewee: 8 and under
 - b. Junior: 9 12
 - c. Intermediate: 13-16
 - d. Senior: 17 21
- 4. Sheep and goat exhibitors may use market sheep/goats or wether dam ewes/does in showmanship.
- 5. Exhibitors must show their own entered livestock in showmanship classes, NO EXCEPTIONS.

HOG SHOW

- 1. Hogs will show by breed, divided into classes by weight.
- 2. Hog show is breed classification only, this is NOT a papered show.
- 3. Hog breed divisions are as follows:
 - a. Light AOB (ie. Landrace, Chester White)

- b. Dark AOB (ie. Spot, Poland China, Tamworth, Hereford)
- c. Berkshire
- d. Duroc
- e. Hampshire
- f. Yorkshire
- g. All Black
- h. Light Crossbred
- i. Dark Crossbred
- 4. Show staff has the right to change breed classifications at the scale. Show staff has final say in breed classification.
- 5. If numbers allow, large breeds may be broken into further weight divisions
- 6. Barrows and gilts will show together.

CALIFORNIA ELITE FUTURITY

NEW FOR 2024!

Futurity show for hogs purchased in 2024 California Elite show. Special thank you to Pete Gomez and all the hog breeders who participated in this sale for sponsoring this event.

- 1. Must have purchased a hog in the 2024 California Elite Sale.
- 2. Hog must be entered in at least Hog Show A to be eligible to show.
- 3. Please provide as much info on your entry as possible to assure correct information is provided to the show committee.
- 4. Breeds will be split into the following divisions:
 - a. Minor Breeds (Berkshire, Duroc, Yorkshire, AOB)
 - b. Major Breeds (Hampshire, All Black, Crossbred)
- 5. Top three in each breed division will be awarded, as well as top three overall.

SHEEP SHOW

- 1. Market lambs will be shown in divisions by breed and weight as follows:
 - a. Dorper
 - b. Southdown
 - c. All Other White Face/White Face Cross
 - d. Hampshire
 - e. Natural
 - f. Black Face Cross
- 2. Show staff has the right to change breed classifications at the scale. Show staff has final say in breed classification.
- 3. If numbers allow, large breeds may be broken into further weight divisions.
- 4. Wethers and ewes are eligible to show in the market show, but **ewes entered in wether dam show are NOT eligible for market show.**

- 5. Wether dam ewes will be shown in breed divisions as follows, show staff has final say in breed classification:
 - a. Southdown
 - b. All Other White Face/White Face Cross
 - c. Natural
 - d. Black Face
 - e. Wether dam ewes will show by weight.
- 6. If numbers allow, wether dams may be broken into further weight divisions

GOAT SHOW

- 1. Market goats will be shown in divisions, broken by weight, as follows:
 - a. Division I
 - b. Division II
 - c. Division III
- 2. Divisions for market goats will be broken after weigh-in. Show staff will break divisions as they see equitable.
- 3. Wethers and does are eligible to show in market divisions, but **does entered in wether dam show are NOT eligible for market show.**
- 4. Wether dam does will show by weight.
- 5. If numbers allow, wether dams may be broken into further weight divisions
